Chapter -1 "A Letter to God"

Q.1 What did Lencho hope for?

Ans. Lencho hoped for good rain as it was much needed for a good harvest.

Q.2 Why did Lencho say the raindrops were like 'new coins''?

Ans. Lencho's crop really needed rain to be a good -harvest. Moreover, by selling the good harvest, he could get new coins. So he said these raindrops were like new coins.

Q.3 How did the rain change? What happened to Lencho's fields?

Q.4 What were Lencho's feelings when the hail stopped?

Q.5 Who and What did Lencho have faith in? What did he do?

Q.6 Who read the letter?

Ans. The postmaster read the letter when a past man brought it to him.

Q.7 What did the postmaster do after reading the letter?

Ans: The postmaster decided to keep Lencho's faith in God intact. He collected about seventy pesos and sent the money to Lencho.

Q.8 Was Lencho surprised to find a letter for him with money in it?

Ans: No, Lencho was not surprised to find a letter for him with money in it. It was because he had full faith in God and he was sure of it.

Q.9 What made Lencho angry after opening the letter?

Ans. Lencho requested God to send him 100 pesos. But God sent him only 70 pesos. He thought that God could not have made a mistake. The post office employees might have taken away the rest. (remaining amount) This made him angry.

Thinking about the text:

Q.1 Who does Lencho have complete faith in? Which sentence in the story tells you this?

Ans- Lencho had complete faith in God.

Q.2 Why does the postmaster send the money to Lencho? Why does he sign the letter "God"?

Ans. The postmaster sends money to Lencho because he does not want to shake the writer's faith in God.

He signs the letter "God" because he opined that Lencho would think that only God, none else, has sent him the money.

Q.3 Did Lencho try to find out who had sent the money to him? Why/ Why not?

Ans: Lencho did not try to find out who had sent the money because he had complete faith in God: He, therefore, did not bother about the sender.

Q. 4 Who does Lencho think has taken the rest of the money? What is the irony in the situation?

Ans. Lencho thinks that the Employees of the post office have taken the rest of the money. The irony in the situation is that the employees of the post office contribute money for Lencho. Yet they are seen by him as "crooks".

Q.5 Are there people like Lencho in the real world? What kind of a person would you say he is? You must select appropriate words to answer the questions.

Ans. Yes, there are still people like Lencho in the real world. Lencho is naive to the world. He is not greedy. He thinks about his family. He has not been comical. He does not know who has sent him money actually and how a letter will reach God without an address.

Q.6 There are two kinds of conflict in the story between humans and nature and between humans themselves. How are these conflicts illustrated?

Q.1 Draw the character sketch of Lencho.
